





and Riverside.

There were no real surprises at the PAC-10 Championships as UCLA came from behind on the second day to sweep by the men and women of Oregon 163 1/2-142 1/2 and 149-123. USC was a strong third in the men's division with 122 points. There were a number of exceptional per-formances by the local schools, especially in the throws. Troy's Balasz Kiss destroyed the colle-giate record in the hammer by over 10 feet with a profound 268-10 toss. In what was expected to be a wide-open meet, the boy's division of the LA City CIF section was just that with Westchester's winning total of 46 one of the lowest winning totals ever. The difference between second and ninth place was only 5 points. In the girl's division, Dorsey came from

behind to pull out the meet by winning the 1600m relay, 63 1/2-56 over Washington.

At the NAIA Championships at Azusa Pacific, Coach Terry Franson's thinclads won the men's division by coming from behind on the fi-nal event. Trailing by 7 2/3 points with only the discus left, AP's Jon Davis and Rene Busta-mante took 4th and 5th respectively, good for 9 points and the Cougars had won another title 105 1/3-104 over Lubbock Christian. In another nail-biter, Southern University beat Central State in the 1600m relay, which decided the women's championship 104 1/2 -103.





## **MOSTLY SHOES**

#### By Cregg A. Weinmann



he beast from Prague, the Czech Express, agony in motion; picturesque adjectives from sports pages of nearly half a century ago-these describe one of the most dominating distance stars from track and field, Emil Zatopek.

The uniqueness of his name and the significance of his accomplishments in distance running allow his visage to be rolled out for Olympic coverage and memorialization every four years. He set 18 world records for distances from 5,000 to 30,000 meters, and he won seven major championships at three different distances. He was a four-time Olympic gold medalist, and added a silver medal and a creditable sixth place marathon finish in 1956 only 6 weeks least from the waist down, near picture perfect. Unquestionably an engineer of locomotion. The Czech express indeed!

The act of running from a kinesiological viewpoint is this: the successive loss and regaining of the balance, during which the feet break contact with the ground in the cycle of each stride. It has been suggested (for at least the past 20 years by numerous podiatrists and sport scientists) that the recovery from breaking contact with the ground during each running stride causes the runner to absorb approximately three times his/her body weight. Runners literally fly during a portion of their run, but gravity is an unfriendly adversary, causing the rapid descent and shock from that flight. The

positioning the hand either down or up would then be either pronation or supination. The foot is not as flexible in its motion as the hand, and can only tilt in (invert) or tilt out (evert). With the momentum of a huge athletic shoe industry, we are now "stuck" with the terms pronation (tilted in) and supination (tilted out) of the foot.

The function of modern-day running shoes is to support the foot and allow the shoe to absorb some of the shock before sending the rest up the line. To offer support, the shoe must position the foot properly on contact. This may be accomplished by the shape of the shoe (straight, slightly curved, or curved), the density of the midsole material (or devices in the midsole), or both. Most runners (an estimated 97%) pronate slightly as they move from heel to toe on each stride. Runners who pronate more than 4 degrees (Subotnick, Athlete's Feet, 1974) are considered overpronators. Shoes which correct over-pronation are usually straight or slightly curved, have board or combination lasts, and have a denser midsole material from the heel through the arch to prevent the excessive inward roll. The major shoe companies have models with special devices built into the midsole to prevent excessive motion, some with very elaborate design.

This has been a result of a consumer market which has dramatically increased from Zatopek's day. At that time shoes were made exclusively of leather with thin leather or gum rubber soles and no consideration of shock absorption. Most careers were short and running mileages were lower. Because of Emil Zatopek's successes, his methods were adopted by runners inspired to explore the limits of the human body. As training intensified, demands for innovative and improved products increased. This has prompted the supply of su-

perior and continually improving products.

after hemia surgery. He is perhaps best remembered for his unmatched distance triple gold medal performance in the 1952 Olympics in Helsinki, Finland, which produced three new Olympic records in the 5,000 meters, 10,000 meters and the marathon.

During the peak of his career, he dominated his rivals completely, ran world records and championship races with equal aplomb, and he looked completely terrible doing it. To begin with, his face gave the expression of a patient undergoing major surgery without the benefit of anesthesia. His appearance left the impression that another step would require more effort than it was possible for him to give. Mechanically, his upper body did nothing to dispel the notion that his facial contortions implied. His head rolled from side to side as he ran; his hands appeared to claw the air as his arms swayed across his chest, and his shoulders lunged forward with each stride. His opponents were not concerned about how he looked. They were concerned about how fast he went. The real motion to watch was below the waist. His legs were fluid, continuous, and piston-like in their efficiency. His gait was, at

foot, being the contact point of each stride (each successful stride, anyway), must disperse this shock through the many joints of the ankle, knee, hip, spinal column, etc. This is not done exactly the same way by every runner, and is likely different in every runner.

In my previous article, I described three foot types based on the height of the arch. These differences cause differences in the runner's gait. A high arched foot does not compress very much on impact, instead sending the shock through the other joints up the line from the foot. A low arched or flat foot compresses or flattens on impact and lessens this shock. Most runners (about 75% by some estimates) land on their heels at the end of each stride, then roll slightly to the inside of the foot and onto the toes to begin the next stride. This inward roll is known as inversion; however, it has become popularized by the term pronation. The outer rolling of the foot as it moves from heel to toe is known as eversion but, once again, has become known by the popular term supination. What is the difference? I suppose it may be semantics, but a hand can be prone (palm down) or supine (palm up). The act of





The Boys' 800 meter event was another cooker of an event in 1995! Michael Granville became prep history's #4 prep ever with a 1:47.96 Arcadia/Foot Locker win the last time he raced Aaron Richburg. Richburg was 1:49.12 there, with a 1:49.36 after a sub-51 second first lap in Section Finals action. Granville was 1:49.43 in his Section Finals race, blasting a 26.5 final 200 (1:46.0 pace) after a 53.8 first 400. Granville was out at 51.8 in the Arcadia race, with the tactical approach to the Finals here by the duo an interesting one. Brandon Pacheco 1:51.29 and Jess Strutzel 1:51.75 would head the pack chasing the talented top entrants.

A star who gets out in front in the Heats in this event and controls things, confident of his abilities to move on with a win, invariably affects the number of qualifiers out of one of the qualifying events with a slow pace and big finish. Richberg did just that out of Heat 1, racing out at 25.8 (200m), then slowing to 55.3 (400m) and 1:25.6 (600m), before charging away to a 1:53.56 win, with Jonevan Homsby also a strong finisher at 1:54,33 to move on the finals. Michael Granville continued to amaze in Heat 2, rocketing out at 25.0 and 52.3. leading there by twenty meters. At 1:22.1, Michael led by twelve meters over James Levine, with Michael accelerating in at 13.8 (7th 100m around the turn 1:48.8 pace!), then rolled down the homestretch to a 1:49.90 win, the easiest sub-1:50 ever seen! Le-vine (1:52.94), Joel Young (1:53.81), and Jeremy Lyon (1:54.18) rolled in the jetstream to qualifying spots. Heat 3 had Jess Strutzel and Brandon Pacheco out at 26.0, with the latter taking over at 54.9 for the 400. #### ■ 1600 Meters

In the Boys 1600m, Michael Stember had put together an im-

pressive recent string of efforts after a slight mid-season injury. with bests that ranged from 1:50.29 (800m), 4:09.8 (1600m national outdoor leader), and 9:02.36 (3200m #4 time nation). The bouncing Jesuit junior has all of his races feature a final lap of amazing acceleration, with no one yet this spring able to run this finishing power out of Stember. Mike missed early April's Arcadia 1600m, with seven Californians there among a top ten pack who all ran under 4:14, with the pack here needing something much faster than the 3:10 first 1200 from that race if someone hoped to beat the Jesuit star.

The Napa (SJ) duo of Mike Blair and Steve Hansen had both run 4:10.9, with Larry Henderson 4:10.97, Greg Nett 4:12.26, Brett Strahan 4:12.30, and Micheil Jones 4:12.47 forming a formidable pack, all ranked among the top fifteen in the nation on the

It would turn out to take a quick 4:15.20 to make the Finals! In Heat 1, a 2:09.1 800m pace had Jon Genant, who we believe is from Branson School in Ross (NCS), not Mt. Tamalpais as indicated in the program, pushed the pace from there, with 2:41.5 (1000m) and 3:13.5 (1200) splits. Brandon Pacheco and Brett Strahan were right on the lead at the gun, with Michael Stember back in fifth. During the last lap, Pacheco, who seems to consider any event in spikes, qualifying or not, one to race in, taking the event at 4:13.72, with Stember well aware of the qualifying formula here, with the top three to move on, 4:14.26 in second, and Strahan 4:14.69 in third qualifying. Heat 2 had North Bakersfield's Chad Schmidt lead through 63.3 and 2:08.5 splits, with Mike Blair, who runs with a head roll, taking over at the gun at 3:13.9. A halfdozen had a good amount left, racing close to 60 seconds for the final lap, with Blair (4:13.48), Lary Henderson 4:13.85, Garrett Jensen (4:13.99), Antonio Arce (4:14.07), Alex Teekel (4:14.13), and Micheil Jones (4:15.20) all moving on to Saturday's finals. There have been a number of efforts in the California State Meet Mile/1600m that stand out in people's minds. From Dennis Carr's 4:08.7 win in the slow heat from 1962 to Mehbrathom Keflezighi's 4:07.67 front end of a 1600-3200m (8:58:11) double win last year, the four lap event with its blend of tactics, talent, and conditioning has had a number of individuals that will be remembered in a very special way. The race is long enough to savor, with the ability of seventeen and eighteen year olds to run a pace so close to 60 seconds for the entire four laps something to sit back and admire greatly. The 1995 event will be one of those long-remembered.

The head-rolling Blair led through 29.5 (200m) and 61.6 (400m) posts, with Brett Strahan taking over at 1:33.3 (600m) and 2:06.0 (800m) splits. The pace had not shaken anyone really through 2:37.6 at the 1000m point, at which time Michael Stember had simply had enough. Rocketing around the pack into the lead, Stember raced the next 200 through the 1200m point, at 28.0 (1200m 3:05.6), then continued to accelerate through the 1400m point at 3:33.8 (28.2 for the last half lap-56.2 in the middle of a high school 1600m!!!). The amazing Jesuit eleventh grader continued to power in, with an un-pressed 30,2 for the final 200m on the way to a 4:04.00 win. The final 600m had taken 1:26.4 for the winner, with a 1:57.2 final 800m. The rocket acceleration away from the field by Stember in the middle of a state-finals quality event will be riveted in the minds of all who witnessed it forever, distance fan or not. In addition to the impressive manner in which it was accomplished, historically it was very significant as the fast-est prep 1600m/mile time recorded in the nation since 1987

Admiration has to go to athletes such as Brandon Pacheco, who finished second at 4:08.59, and Larry Henderson, third at 4:09.58, who had to overcome the sense of the race being ripped away from them during that third lap, to record personal bests. Stember's time converts to the equivalent of the State Meet Record of 4:05.4 for a full mile set by Mark Schilling back in 1972 (I) on Oroville High School's dirt track. The multi-sport Jesuit star who stuck with running his eleventh grade year had it pay off in fine style. Now let's just hope he does not go out and sprain an ankle as a Varsity Cheerleader his twelfth grade year!

# **USATF** Junior Nationals

Walnut, California - Friday, June 23rd -

Saturday, June 24th.

Despite an entry blank that was out very late (mid-May), with the resulting failure to promote the meet during the late winter and spring that held possible participation down, a surprsingly successful Junior Championships were held in California in Walnut in late June. Many of California's prep and first year college stars were in attendance, with a wet spring probably leaving locals a bit more hungry for top-level compettion at this time of year than most others. The first two athletes in all events (except Girls Pole Vault and Hammer) would make the U.S. Pan American Junior team for that competition later this summer in Santiago, Chile. The Meet was open to athletes who were born 1976 or later, with the international definition of a "junior" one with the international definition of a "junior" one who will not turn 20 during the year of competition (so for "Junior" age competition in 1995 one could not be born in 1975, but anytime in 1976 as that athlete would not turn 20 during the year.

Melissa Price (PV), Angela Williams (100m), Julia Stamps (3000m), Joanna Hayes (100m Hurdles), and Suzy Powell (DT) were big local female stars in the meet, with Marques Hollwell (100m), Dea Marque (100m), Milke

Holiwell (100m), Obea Moore (400m), Mike Stember (1500m), and the rest of the UCLA weight crew Golden Staters starring on the male

Melissa Price, the Fresno-state bound recent grad of Kingsburg HS, was counting closely the big-meet chances she had left for a 13-foot pole vault clearance as she came into this meet, with a big 12-9 American Record the previous week end to win the Senior title in Sacramento. A field of 22 met the entry standard of 9 feet, with Californians dominating the event— Amanda Bauer was 5th (10-08), Glendale junior high star Bridget Pearson 4th (10-08), Kristi Draher 3rd (10-11.75), and surprising Vanessa Brenton 2nd (11-03.75), with our star Price coming in at 3.05 (10-03,75), with our star Price coming in at 3.05 (10-00) and then next trying the 3.45m (11-03.75) height, surprisingly taking two attempts to clear there. Brenton, 3722 points last year in the Hepitathlon, ended the weekend shockingly as the #5 U.S. Female Pole Vaulter ever (!) at 11-03,75, the #3 Junior-age Vaulter in U.S. History, and the #2 All-Time High Schooler in the event. Anyway, Price was over 3.55 (11-07.75) on her first attempt while the gallest Brenton went out. first attempt while the gallant Brenton went out there. Melissa next was over 3.70 (12-01.5) on her second attempt, with three attempts to get over 3.81 (12-06). With much of crowd remain-ing after the end of the running events to watch Price at the end of Saturday evening, the serious stuff started now, with a first attempt clearance

of 3.91 (12-10) and shocking first trial clearance of 4.01 (13-01.75). The crowd went nuts, with Price making three attempts at 4.06 (13-03.75), ending the evening as World History's =#7 Pole Vaulter ever, with a great close to her Golden State season. It was a neat close to a fine meet.

A star was born in the Women's 100 Meters. A great field was gathered which included NCAA 6th placer Kwajalein Butler (LSU), Andrea Anderson, Kelli White, Aminah Haddad, Jernae Wright, and Texas 5A Champ Kim McGruder-none of them would win! Frosh Angela Williams, State 400m (53.40) champ, dropped to the 100 here, with a blazing 11.30w (+2.2) first heat win over Jernae Wright (11.62w). Kelli White (11.43w +2.6), Kwajalein Butler (11.37w +2.9), and Andrea Anderson (11.48w +2.1) were other Prelim Heat winners, and one just had a sense when the serious run and the just had a series when the serious run-ning started the elders would take over. Ha! Ha! you think. In one of California prep history's amazing break-throughs, Angela Williams ab-solutely took apart this great group of young sprinters, out even with them, but after 15 meters shifting into a gear that none of these athletes was able to cope with this evening, blasting to a two meter win at 11.24 (wind +1.9) over Butler 11.43, with the other prep veterans back a meter from there. It was an unreal performance that left spectators speechless! It took down the that left spectators speechless! It took down the old national frosh record of Brenda Winston (San Gorgonio, San Bemardino) 11.60 from 1976, and amazingly makes Williams the #4 prep U.S. 100 meter runner in history behind Chandra Cheeseborough (11.13), Marion Jones (11.14), and Wendy Vereen (11.17). Marion's 11.17 at age 15 was the only record she did not get, but the 11.24 did take down Marion's 11.29 Junior Championship Meet Record from 1991. Interestingly, Marion made her big breakthrough and showed the same spark at age 15 in her sprint sweep of National Athlete of the 15 in her sprint sweep of National Athlete of the Year Zundra Feagin in the Arcadia/Foot Locker Invitational when she ran 11.38 and 22.87 (latter Williams did have absolutely perfect conditions with an eighty degree evening, 1.9 meters of second of wind behind her and all, but it was her margin of domination over the nation's best in this age-group that was overwhelming! The 4.23 GPA student from Chino HS played as a guard on the school's JV Basketball team this past winter, with many of her practice sessions spent in previous years on this facility as a member of the Southern California Cheetahs Track Club while growing up.

Over 200 meters (Angela Williams did not run the event here) Kelli White was the winner at 23.49 (+1.20), with Aminah Haddad 23.58 for second, and Andrea Anderson 4th at 23.82.

Julia Stamps put on another show, here in the 3000 meter event. With the eligible Stanford Collegiate crew (Sarna Renfro and Kortney Dunacombe) tired after a long year at that lev-el, Julia had to do the work here herself. A fairly sophisticated group of preps rolled through the first 400 at 77 seconds all right on Stamps' shoulder, at which point the Santa Rosa soph decided 77-80 second laps would not get the time she wanted this day. Moving it up to 73 for the second go-round, Julia quickly separated herself from the pack and seemed intent on 75 second laps, a pace that would come out to the low 9:20's, quicker than the 9:28.50 she ran in low 9:20's, quicker than the 9:28.50 she ran in this meet last year when she had company for all the pacing work. A 3:08 first 1000 meters was right at that 75 second per lap tempo, with the second 1000 meters, again totally solo, a bit quicker (3:05.4) 8:13.4. This is some serious running, right at 10:00 pace for a full 3200m, so the fatigue eventually did set in, with our star getting to the one lap to go point needing a final 400 under 73 seconds to get both the national age-16 and soph class record of 9:22.68 by Ai-leen O'Connor from Maryland way back in 1977. It was not easy, but the Foot Locker Na-tional Cross-Country champ came through with a determined effort over the entire final 400 me-ters, breaking through the finish line at 9:21.99, just off the Meet Record of 9:21.0 by Ceci Hopp, one of Julia's buddies, from way back in 1984. The age and grade record had fallen, with one of California's fabled running careers continuing to force the printers to lay down new lines of print in the record books. Joanna Hayes continued her spectacular

senior prep season of hurdling here. At this level we are wading into some real heavies, with et we are wading into some real neavies, with Latasha Colander, last year's Arcadia/Foot Locker winner in the 100m Hurdles going on to place second in the 1994 World Junior Championships at 13.30, with a 13.27 this spring and 6th in the NCAA Division I meet for the University of North Carolina. Yolanda McCray (University of Miami) was the other 1995 Co-World Junior leader with a 13.27 best from earlier this spring. Only two girls would make the LLS Pan spring. Only two girls would make the U.S. Pan American team, so Miss Hayes had her hands full! 13.55 performer Bisa Grant (UCLA) and Davetta Shepherd were other significant Golden Staters part of a great field. Colander (13.67 +1.60), Hayes (13.35w +3.30), and Grant (13.85w +2.20) were Prelim Heat winners, as it

took 14.00 (I) to make the Finals (Shepherd was 13.83w for third behind Hayes to qualify)! Joanna's Finals race was another this day for the highlights reel, running with the pack for two flights, then steadily pulling away to an unreal 13.06w (+2.50) win over Colander's 13.27w in second. The 13.06w makes Hayes the #2 All-Time U.S. Prep performer under any conditions (behind Candy Young's 12.95), and the #4 U.S. Junior ever. Joanna had as good a high school season as any prep in the nation in any event, with some great running ahead at UCLA over the next four years. Grant was 4th at 13.60w and Shepard 6th at 13.72w. Joanna came back for fifth in the 400m hurdles at 59.07, with Angela Harris, last year's prep state champ at Skyline of Oaldand, 6th at 59.67.

Suzy Powell continued her fine first season at UCLA, lengthening her best in the Discus ear-

lier this spring out to a U.S. Junior All-Time best of 190-06, and finishing off her local season in fine style here. A fine series had Suzy dominate the competition with 172-01, 176-05, 175-05, 181-01, 181-00, and 175-03 throws setting a new Meet Record in bettering her own 180-08 from two years ago in Spokane, Washington. Mandy Buckey threw a fine 154-07 for sixth place, with Nadia Lopez 8th at 152-05, and Chaniqua Ross 9th at 151-04.

The male side of the competition had its local stars! Preps Marques Holiwell, Obea Moore, and Michael Stember starred in fine comeptition. Marques Holiwell, part of a top sprint group that included numerous NCAA Division! conference finalists at the top level, had the quickest Prelim time of 10.37 (wind +1.7). In the Finals, the University of Arizona-bound West Bakersfield HS star closed spectacularly, as always, over the final 40 meters, to win in a yearly national prep best of 10.33 (wind +1.70).

In the 400 meters, Obea Moore would renew a rivalry with Connecticut prep Jerome Young, who Moore had edged 45.88-45.89 in the Golden West Invitational the second weekend of the month. Obea (46.69) and Young (46.84) were heat winners, with two-time Arcadia/Foot Locker champ, Desmond Johnson (Louisiana prep) the other qualifying race winner at 46.69. At the Golden West, Obea had come from behind to take Young (and Johnson). This week Moore was out even, at 21.6 through 200m with Young. With 120 meters to go the shoe was on the other foot this time round, as Young sammed on the accelerator and powerfully edged away from Obea, recording a spectacular 45.01 clocking, with Moore second at 45.63. Obea's 45.63 is the #2 soph time ever behind William Reed's 45.4 tenth grade record, with Young's 45.01 winner the #2 prep clocking ever in the event, behind Darrell Robinson's 44.69 National Record from 1982. Only Henry Thomas (45.09), Calvin Harrison (45.25), and Bill Green (45.51) sit shead of Moore among California preps on the all-time list.

California Prep stars, Michael Stember and Brandon Pacheco, were Friday Prelim Heat 1500m winners at 3:54.35 and 3:53.48, respectively. The duo have faced each a number of times, with Saturday's Finals controlled by the twosome. USC-bound Pacheco was out at 61.0 (400m), with the Brethren Christian star, who came quite a ways from 4:27.01 (1994) to 4:08.50 in the last year over 1600m, still ahead at 2:05.5 for 800m. As he has done recently, Stember picks a lap and a half to go ahead, with his move here against a more mature field seemingly more controlled than some others, but once the Jesuit HS star took the lead one had the sense that the race was under his control, with a 59.2 final 400 bringing Michael home at 3:49.74, with Pacheco a pleasant surprise in second at 3:50.26.

The UCLA weight crew usually has this as a "clinic" to show the ability of Coach Art Venegas to successfully work with some of the nation's most talented young athletes. Suzy Powell had starred on the Women's side, with Luke Sullivan (179-10) and Scott McPherren (179-05) taking 1-2 in the Discus here. Matt Pentecost, not yet a Bruin as a recent graduate of Loyola HS in L.A., surprised with a win in the Shot Put, tossing the 16 pound implement out to 54-06.

Carla Estes looked very strong in taking the 400m event at 53.27, with second place a bit of a surprise. Frosh Kadrina Coffee had had a fine season at Palmdale HS after a fabled age-group career, with a big finish here and improvement

by over a second to 53.96 to earn her U.S. National uniform for the Pan Am team! State HS Champ in the High Jump, Tara Flaming, faced fellow 6-footer Jeana McDowell of Arizona, with McDowell winning at 5-11.25, but Flaming having few misses on the way to her 5-10 best to place second and make the U.S. team.

Mt. SAC's own Jason McGinnis led a California 1-2-3 sweep in the Men's High Jump,

SAC's own Jason McGinnis led a California 1-2-3 sweep in the Men's High Jump, with Jeremy Fisher, finishing his first year at the Big-10 Champion school, University of Wisconsin, second and State prep champ, Michael Wilkins, third, all at the same 7-00.25 height. Borya Orloff of UC Irvine by way of St. John Bosco HS in Bellflower, was the Pole Vault winner at a fine 17-00. Clarence Scott continued his fine year in the Long Jump, running into 25-10.5 jumper Dominick Milner of the University of Florida, with Milner 25-03.25w (+6,50) to win, with Scott earning his U.S. jersey with a 24-08.25w (+7.60) for second. Marc Mazzoni took the Hammer over a College group at 178-06. Justin Marrujo took the 10k walk at 46:16.1, an improvement over his 1994 winning 46:50.31 time.

Rondie Gibbs, from Cal Poly, Pomona forced the pace for most of the Men's 10,000m event, eventually finishing second to the University of Portland's Tim Briggs 30:57.95-31:12.53. Konrad Knutsen, at the University of Oregon via Del Campo HS in Fair Oaks, was second in the Steeplechase at 9:23.7, with prep Jeremy Lyon of Hesperia running an excellent 9:30.2 prep time in third.

Felix Sanchez ran a super 400m Hurdles race, finishing third in 51.33, the #14 Prep per-

formance ever in U.S. History.

A fine Women's Heptathlon competition had Orange County prep stars Kerry O'Bric and Ashley Bethel battling for high placings. Bethel sat in second after the first day, with O'Bric in fifth. Kerry suprisingly won the Long Jump portion of the event at 18-04.75 (Bethel 17-01.75) with Ashley 3rd (3646) at that point and O'Bric 4th (3597) overall. O'Bric was 110-00 for fourth in the Javelin to move into third at 4141, with Bethel 91-06 (8th) and 4083 for fourth going into the final 800m event. Kerry was 2:33.49 in that two lap run, with Ashley 2:38.85. O'Bric finished third at 4791, up from her tenth here a year ago, with Bethel in 6th at 4669, but impressively establishing new National Age-15 and Frosh class records (old age 4640 by Tiffany Lott of Utah from 1991 and grade 4540 Brandy Venable from Mississippi from 1985). The two athletes who finished ahead of O'Bric (who has 1978 year of birth) in the competition both have 1976 years of birth, so they are ineligible for the 1996 Junior Meet (those born 1977 and later eligible for that 1996 competition), which will qualify on to the World Junior Championships in Australia next summer. Bethel, with her 1980 year of birth was by over a year the youngest athlete in the field of sixteen! # Thousand Oaks Cross Country

By Jack Farrell Thousand Oaks High School

# GENERAL PHILOSOPHY

1. What you're trying to accomplish. Our training is fairly consistent year-round for our veteran runners. There is not a great deal of difference in a training run on September 15 and November 15. We do not follow a hard-easy pattern. All of our runs are basically tempo runs-fast, but within the comfort zone. Our mileage increases slightly from early season to mid-season (from 49 to 56 miles per week, from 7 to 8 miles per day), and the pace gradually quickens as runners become fitter, but the effort is fairly consistent. Our goal is to lower the comfort zone of our steady state runs. Athletes gradually dropping from 7 minutes per mile to 6 minutes per mile will correspondingly drop their race pace 30 to 45 seconds or more per mile.

2. Differences between boys and girls. Girls will typically run about a mile less per day and about 45 seconds to 1 minute slower per mile. Some of our best runners, however, have run right with the best boy runners.

3. Areas of emphasis. Keeping major components in balance (frequency, duration and intensity) and utilizing the races as part of training.

4. Training cycles. We run a kind

of two-week cycle. Mondays are the long run, which is one mile longer than the average daily training distance. Assuming a race on Saturday, the first Wednesday will be repetition work, ie. 4x1320 at race pace with 75-90 seconds between each. This will be done on a simulated cross country course, trails or grass. The second Wednesday will be a pick-up run. If we race on Thursday as well as Saturday, then the repetition running and the pick-up run move to Tuesday. The other days are just regular street and dirt trail running. There are no especially hard days and no recovery days. We added a feature this season to strengthen the end of our races (from a Runner's World article). We call them cycles. We usually do just one. This is the only work we do on the track. The athlete runs a quarter at street pace, then a 330 at race pace for 3 miles, then a 220 at half-mile pace and then a 110 nearly all-out. The recovery is a continuous jog the same distance as the run. A cycle is exactly 5 laps. We usually do a cycle after the longer run on Monday. We experimented with our veteran runners with two cycles, but found that one was sufficient. After all, it comes at the end of the longest training day.

5. High, Medium or Low Mileage? Our veterans will run about 7 miles a day in September and about 8 miles a day in October and November.

6. Things we try and watch for. About 90% of what we are trying to accomplish happens out on the roads. It's necessary to watch this very closely. I use a car, a bike, or run when I can (it's getting tougher the older I get). I look for athletes running comfortably fast, a kind of fast, effortless float as a sign of fitness. I try to control athletes at either extreme, usually the ones who are racing the workouts (they're over their head attempting to stay up with athletes out of their range) or ones who chronically undertrain (they want to stop every few blocks and stretch or go to the bathroom, or take on more water, or cut the run if they can get away with it). I am highly visible with my athletes on the roads, not only to discourage cutting, but also to reward those who are working hard and want the coach to know it.

7. How long is this period? Out athletes spend about 30 training days at a given duration and then move up a mile per day to a maximum which varies depending on their age, ability, gender and motivation. Therefore we have a number of athletes doing variations of the same basic workout. Most street runs have 2,3,4,5,6,7,8, and 9 mile versions. (See "Typical Training Week" box adjacent.)

### Early Season Training

Friday

August 20 through September 30

One of our favorite workouts during this period is REPETITIONS

- 1. Name -- Repetitions (repeats usually at 1/4 the racing distance).
- 2. Purpose -- Practicing, and becoming accustomed to, race pace. (This is especially valuable for newer runners.)
- 3. Warm-up -- During cross country we always run from school to a park in the neighborhood to warm up the muscles before stretching. This warm-up run varies from 3/4 of a mile to 2 1/4 miles. The distance, however, counts in the total run for the day. Athletes pair up and do a series of static stretches for about 20 minutes, followed by form drills and shake-ups.
- 4. The repetitions take place sometime during the regular run for the day, usually more toward the end than the beginning. This is more a matter of logistics than philosophy.
  - a. Athletes are organized into 4 to 5 ability groups. Usually only the varsity athletes will run with timed rest. Lower level runners may not com-

- plete as many repetitions either. b. Athletes are asked to run race pace, ie. 4 minutes for 16:00 runners and 4:30 for 18:00 runners.
- 5. Things that we look for -- We'd like the athletes to simulate racing as much as possible. Sometimes we even do the repetitions as cut-downs, ie. 4:00 -- 3:55 -- 3:50 -- 3:45. We've discovered that without timed rest the athletes tend to race these, that is, run them considerably under race pace.
- 6. The remainder of the day's run serves as the warm-down.

# Mid-Season Training

October 1 through November 7 One of our favorite workouts during this period is THE PICK-UP RUN.

- 1. Name -- The Pick-up Run.
- 2. Purpose -- a). We want our athletes to be able to hold pace or increase pace during the last half of a 3 mile race, b). Since all runners are basically the same stride pattern, 170-190 strides per minute, regardless of pace, athletes run faster by striding further and this is accomplished by using more of their oxygen uptake. We ask our runners during

the last 1 1/2 to 2 miles of a regular run to go through a series of staged drops in pace. They are to drop the pace until they are uncomfortable and then hold it until they are comfortable, and then drop it again. Usually 4-6 drops will take place during the pick-up. A typical varsity boy runner may drop his pace from 6:40 to 6:20 to 6:00 to 5:50, or even faster. The last several hundred yards may actually exceed race pace, c). This verifies to our runners that they can get comfortable at faster paces and gives them the willingness and the aptitude to do this in actual races. In races we sometimes ask our runners to hang in for the first mile and then do a 2 mile pick-up run to the finish.

- 3. Warm-up -- During cross country, we always run from school to a park in the neighborhood to warm up the muscles before stretching. The warm-up run varies from 3/4 of a mile to 2 1/4 miles. The distance, however, counts in the total run for the day. Athletes pair up and do a series of static stretches for about 20 minutes, followed by form drills and shake-ups.
- 4. How we run the workout -- It's important that the athletes tack the pick-up onto a fairly continuous run. Any bathroom or water stops should be kept to a minimum and taken fairly early in the regular run. If an athlete stops right before the pick-up begins, it virtually negates the beneficial effects. He simply ends up running a two-mile race to the
- 5. Things that we look for -- Racing each other is discouraged in this workout, but it is hard to avoid. Athletes are also discouraged from dropping down to race pace immediately and holding it all the way in. This work-out is a learning process and some athletes learn to do it early and better than others. Almost everyone learns eventually. I often ask our runners to time their last mile or two. but sometimes I ask them to turn off their watches if then cannot avoid racing

# Late Season Training

November 8 through
Foot Locker West Regional
One of our favorite workouts during
this period is THE HILL WORK-OUT

1. Name -- The Hill Work-out.

2. Purpose -- Thousand Oaks is a fairly hilly area. Even the streets that run around the school incorporate rolling, sometimes steep hills. We do not even count these; we utilize these hills in most of our regular runs. As such, we only specifically train on hills about 3 to 4 times a season. We are known as a hill team and do tend to compete well on hilly courses like Mt. SAC. But, since so much of our hill work is unavoidable, actual hill repeats are relatively rare.

We like to use two different hills for this workout. One hill is on a 700 yard loop and is about 70 yards fairly steeply up and another 70 yards similarly down. We usually couple this work-out with the pick-up run. We may do 3 x this 700 yard loop, jogging the last 100 yards of it. We will then continue the regular run from this point and begin the pick-up run 2 to 3 miles later. Another hill loop we use is in a canyon and is a steep set of switchbacks about 600 yards to the top. It is about 2 to 3 times the length and difficulty of the switchbacks at Mt. SAC. We may run it 2 or 3 times, but at street pace rather than race pace, jogging slowly down from the top. We never practice downhill running. I do not know if the hill repeats make us better hill runners, or simply prove to us we are already accomplished hill runners. Our better runners always look very impressive on these workouts. It may be just a confidence builder. Except for that, I honestly think we could do without it.

3. Warm-up -- During cross country we always run from school to a park in the neighborhood to warm up the muscles before stretching. The warm-up run varies from 3/4 of a mile to 2 1/4 miles. The distance, however, counts in the total

run for the day. Athletes pair up and do a series of static stretches for about 20 minutes, followed by form drills and shake-ups.

How we run the workouts -- See #2 above.

5. Things that we look for -- We feel . that races are lost, not won on hills--you win races on the flat. As such, we try to simply hold position up and down hills, although we may move up at the expense of over-committed runners. When hill training, we try to get the runners to run tall on the hills and be conscious of the aid their arm swing can give them. The oxygen debt incurred in ascending a hill will be repaid in about the same amount of time on the other side. After a hard one-minute uphill, an athlete will be back in homeostasis (out of debt) about a minute later in the race. We tell them to hang onto the pace and wait to feel good again.

 Athletes do not really get a warmdown on this day as the pick-up run ends at or below race, pace.

# ✓ A Letter to the COACHES' CORNER . . .

Dear Sir,

During this time of hand-wringing, when so many are gloomy about the future of track and field, we'd like to offer a few rays of sunshine. People have expressed fears about the erosion of the bases of our sport in the US, including a drop in numbers participating in high school track. Our experience is the opposite—our numbers are exploding, to the point where we have created a completely different set of problems!

Our league currently consists of eight small schools, all college preparatory, with a total enrollment of under 2300. Five years ago there were only five schools and only about 135 competitors in our league championships. This year we had just over 300 athletes in the championship meet! One of the remarkable things about this explosion is that only half the schools actually have tracks on their campuses!

There seem to be two major factors causing this remarkable growth. One (usually overlooked by doomsayers) is that **kids like track!** At least one school added a track program to its existing sports after a student poll indicated a stronger wish to add it than any other. The excitement and sparkle in the athletes' eyes at meets speak volumes.

The second factor is a group of coaches who like track and think it's important. Most are teachers at the schools, not walk-ons.

They show their enthusiasm running effective programs with limited or non-existent facilities. They also attend clinics at a high rate. working to improve themselves.

Now we have become victims of our own success. The lack of tracks makes scheduling difficult. Dual meets are basically impossible. When teams were smaller 6-way meets were possible. But with our great growth, we ended up with some 31/2 to 4 hour hexagonal and octagonal endurance contests. We will try quadrangular meets next year but still have to face the problem of renting tracks for meets. Transportation to meets is another obstacle we continually overcome. Our schools are located in 4 area codes!

Our league isn't a powerhouse by California standards. It is rare that we produce any scholarship athletes, but we do have a good number go on to compete in various divisions of college track. In 1991 we had 6 athletes compete in the Southern Section Finals. This year we had 32. So our quality is rising as well as our numbers.

Our lesson for reviving interest is simple to see, but hard to achieve. Given that young people like our sport, all it takes is enthusiastic, hard-working, creative coaches. if we can promote the growth of our sport with so many obstacles, others can too.

### Modesto Relays From KEITH CONNING

MODESTO, May 13 --The Modesto Relays is struggling to exist. It no longer has a major sponsor, so it can't pay big bucks to attact the top stars. This year it had to compete with the Mobil Grand Prix meet in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Also it rained this morning, which dissuaded some people from making the trek from the Bay Area into the Central Valley. However, after a few sprinkles and cold weather in the morning, it cleared up and the sun even came out.

Danny Harris (Unattached), the silver medalist in the 1984 Olympics, won the 400 intermediate hurdles in 48.74, the fastest time in the world this year. The previous world leader was Samuel Matete of Zambia at 48.84 on May 3. The previous American leader was senior Ryan Hayden (St. Augustine) at 49.02 on April 28. It was Harris' first race of the season. Kevin Young (Unattached), the world record holder at 46.78, placed second in 50.11.

John Godina (UCLA), a senior, won the shot put at 69-2. It was the longest collegiate throw and third longest by an American this season indoors or outdoors. Junior Brent Noon (Georgia) was the previous collegiate leader at 68-1 1/2 on April 15. Godina also won the discus at 202-9. He is the col-

legiate leader at 209-4 on March 25. Sharon Couch (Olsten's) won the long jump at 22-2 1/4. Marieke Veitman (World Class), the American outdoor leader at 22-5 on April 28, placed second at 21-6.

Edie Boyer (Olympic Development) won the women's discus at 198-4, the second best throw by an American this season. Melisa Weis (Olympic Development) is the American leader at 199-8 on March 25. Dawn Dumble (UCLA) placed second at 194-2. Dumble is the collegiate leader at 195-9 on March 25. Kristin Kuehl (Olympic Development) placed third. Weis was fourth at 191-6. Freshman Suzy Powell (UCLA/Downey High School, Modesto 94) was fifth at 190-6, a new American Junior record. Powell also set an American Junior record of 188-4 here last year.

Erv Hunt, the Cal and 1996 U.S. Olympic coach, had a close call on his way to the meet. His car went down an embankment and turned over. Fortunately, Erv was not injured. Erv's father and twin brother were killed in an automobile accident when he was 12-years-old.
